

APPLICATION TO BEGIN THE PRACTICUM TO BECOME A PRACTITIONER IN DDP



Application materials required

The process for collecting the application materials varies across countries. In the UK your Primary Consultant collates your application materials. Please ask your Primary Consultant about the process in your country.

1. DDP Level 1 and Level 2 training certificates

Certificates, or evidence of dates, that the required hours of Certified DDP Training has been completed.

2. Recommendation from a DDP Consultant

Recommendation of Certified DDP Consultant that s/he has seen a DVD of your practice and you are at a level of practice to begin the practicum.

3. Degree(s)

Confirmation of appropriate degree(s) in mental health or social care.

4. Professional experience

Description of your professional experience (professional vita is sufficient).

5. Narrative

A brief narrative including a brief personal and work history, with a description of how you intend to use DDP in your work. Please don't feel you have to go into detail. *(1 page max)*

6. Practicing certificate or professional registration

Confirmation of professional licensure, professional registration, or other documentation of proof of ability to legally practice in your country, state or jurisdiction.

7. Professional Indemnity Insurance

Confirmation that you have your own professional indemnity insurance or that your organisation covers you for your DDP activities

8. Attestation document

To confirm you have no criminal convictions, malpractice suits etc. This needs to be downloaded and completed.

9. Permission from your employer, if relevant

If employed by an agency or organisation, written permission from your supervisor, line manager or director of the agency, to use your work for the practicum.

10. Consent and permission to show recordings of your work

Written consent from the family and, in addition, if employed by an agency or organisation, written assurance that the applicant has permission to show videos of treatment sessions or other interventions used for the practicum.
