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Khadija is a Senior Lecturer and a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy in the School of Education and Social Sciences. Her PhD centres on race equality by exploring the lived experiences of Black and Minority Ethnic teachers in Scotland with a focus on celebrating their cultural, linguistic and religious identities.

Khadija is the co-founder and Chair of SAMEE. This is a community-led organisation providing support to educators and those in support and guidance roles across the Scottish Education system – early years, schools, colleges and universities.

Khadija received the Scottish Trade Union Congress Equality Award in 2019.

Khadija is the first BAME Muslim educator to be elected as the Vice-Convenor of the General Teaching Council for Scotland (GTCS). She is the Chair of the Advance HE/Scottish Funding Council project 'Tackling Racial Harassment in Universities and Colleges'.

Developing a Culturally Responsive Pedagogy:

This session rests upon the uncomfortable truth that racism is normal, it's pervasive. It's in society and it is in our institutional settings, it's in the everyday!

This platform will provide opportunities to engage in some critical discussions about how practitioners can develop a culturally responsive practice which acknowledges, nurtures and celebrates the diverse, racialized identities of young people and their families. Often times the discourse around cultural and linguistic barriers focusses on a deficit approach rather than the added value and creativity that it brings.

This session will be an opportunity to ask questions and share good practice in developing effective strategies in promoting partnerships with all families.
